




The voice of Jefferson Park

Controversial project up for vote

A vote will be held Tuesday, Dec. 7, on whether Jefferson Park United Neighbors will support a controversial seven unit condo project near the corner of Clay and W. 22nd Ave.

Jefferson Heights has been scaled down from its original planned number of units and scope in accordance with some community comments. However, residents on the blocks adjacent to the property continue to voice concern. They say the property can not sustain the concentration of units and people, are unhappy about the size of the structure and note the building does not comply with the recently enacted zoning laws.

In order for the project to be built, a zone change would have to enacted. The builder Brian Ray, has asked the JPUN support his request to the zoning board for a zoning change. Ray says he feels the project would be an asset to the community.

If built, the high-end, three-story structure would be situated adjacent to Jefferson Park and will provide views of the Denver skyline.

Residents note that it will also provide views of their backyards.

The debate is likely to be heated and it is important that those individuals who are directly affected by the development come and vote on whether to support or not support the project.

The Land Use Committee voted to bring the decision the JPUN General Membership meeting after providing the caveat that they feel the vote should be made by the residents of Jefferson Park and especially those who live in the homes within close proximity.



Federal Boulevard Streetscape Planning Steps Forward

Beginning last July the Federal Boulevard Partnership created a working group to develop concepts for streetscape improvements along Federal. Streetscape is rather like landscape but with additional design elements relating to street furniture, lighting, sidewalks, traffic design and landuse. Currently the Partnership is developing a vision in cooperation with JPUN to identify preferred uses, activities and pedestrian treatments. Neighborhood plans such as this provide important information to city and state officials as they engage in allocation of project resources.

In September the working group identified a pilot project for the Federal Boulevard block between 24th and 25th Avenues. Rationale for concentration in this area is based upon previous work initiated by the Town Square project on 25th Avenue, in addition to the importance of 23rd and 26th Avenues traversing Jefferson Park neighborhood. At this time the group is gathering basic planning data and photographs of the block along Federal.

Marshall Vanderburg with the Partnership will send introductory letters to the property owners in the next several weeks. This will be followed by public meetings in the neighborhood to gather recommendations and secure comments on the proposed streetscape design. Your input is requested, so please plan to join us.

The next scheduled meeting of the streetscape design group is December 2nd at 7:00 PM.
