## Sustainable Landscaping Project Planned for I-25 Exit

Volunteer-Run Project Will Create Much Needed Traffic and Pedestrian Visibility

On October 26 and November 3 over 100 volunteers will eradicate overgrown vegetation and reshape and plant the gateway area at the 23rd Avenue exit off of I-25, an interchange that has seen multiple accidents over the years, in part due to the overabundance of weeds and growth that obstruct visibility for cars, cyclists and pedestrians.

- This stretch of land is seen by hundreds of thousands of cars each day and is one of the key entrances to North West Denver neighborhoods, Sports Authority Field at Mile High and businesses on Water Street and in LoHi and Lower Downtown.
- The landscaping plan will create a sustainable, colorful prairieland ecosystem, native to Colorado, which will require little/no maintenance.
- The project entails sheet mulching which utilizes recycled cardboard and dried leaves as an insulator and promotes active plant growth during the winter months. This will be the largest use of biodegradable sheet mulching employed in Colorado.
- The majority of plant irrigation will occur through creatively using the natural erosion pattern to carry runoff water to the plants. These native plants are designed to be self-regulating and self-regenerating over time.

This project's plans are based on Permaculture, a branch of ecological design and engineering that develops self-maintained agricultural systems modeled from natural ecosystems. The rejuvenation of I-25, exit 211 is a collaborative effort between Jefferson Park United Neighbors, CDOT, Children's Museum of Denver, Mile High Youth Corp., Groundwork Denver and other local area businesses and community organizations.

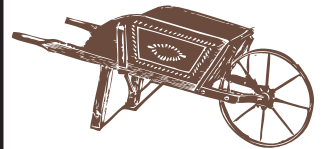
NEW PARKING SIGNS GO UP ONE MORNING AND COME DOWN THE FOLLOWING AFTERNOON! By Doris Blyth

If you live in Jefferson Park, you know that parking during stadium events can be somewhat of a circus. Parking restrictions on the block of 2200 Clay Street have been particularly confusing for residents. The parking signs posted on this block for many years stated "NO PARKING DURING STADIUM EVENTS". The problem with these signs arose in the difficulty of defining a stadium event. Events occur at the stadium on almost a daily basis, but it's only when attendance is expected to exceed 20,000 the City of Denver Right of Way Enforcement will implement parking restrictions. It's well understood that Bronco games are considered stadium events, but what about the soccer game on a Wednesday night in mid-July? Many residents in this block have been caught off guard on these non-Bronco game occasions and have been surprised to find their vehicle ticketed and possibly towed. Enforcement was not consistent and it was confusing for everybody.

In an attempt to clarify parking restrictions, the City of Denver Public Works department installed new parking signs early Wednesday, September 26. These new signs restricted parking in this block to two hours between the hours of 5am and 11pm and prohibited parking between the hours of 11pm and 5am. Within hours, citizen complaints began pouring into Mayor Michael Hancock's office, City Councilwoman Susan Shepherd's office, at large councilwomen Robin Kniech and Debbie Ortega's offices and the office of Parking Services. The new parking restrictions eliminated nearby parking for the residents and businesses in this block. The city listened to the citizens of this community and responded with amazing efficiency. The parking restriction signs were removed from this block in the early afternoon on Thursday, Sept. 27.

Going forward, temporary "NO PARKING" signs on the block of 2200 Clay Street will be dropped off with other traffic management signs prior to major stadium events. The presence of these signs will alert residents to an upcoming event and will remove any question as to whether or not parking is allowed during stadium events. The residents on this block are extremely appreciative for the responsiveness displayed by the City of Denver. **What have I learned from this experience?**

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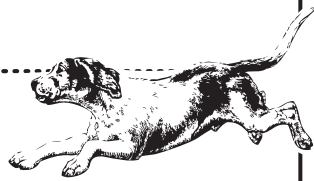

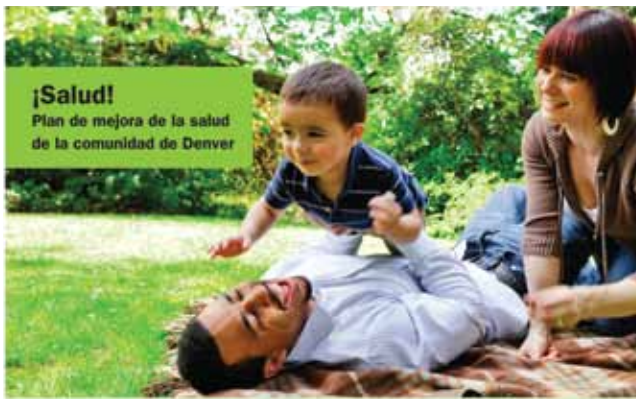

## Construction is also underway in the neighborhood for the following projects:

- 8 - units at 26th & Clay
- 4 - units at 21st & Elliot
- 2 - units at 22nd & Clay
- 1 - unit & 2 retail spaces in the former Granada Theater on 25th

The development potential in our neighborhood has also resulted in the abandonment of a 7-unit project at 27th & Decatur. More than 4 years after the launch party, PURE Townhomes failed to materialize. Large parcels on the corner of 27th & Decatur, some to be occupied by PURE, were recently sold, while the LUC has no word on any development plans, it should be noted that the PURE development was well below the maximum build out allowed by zoning in this area.

Another project that has been called off is the 338-unit Alexan project at the Hotel VQ site. While no word was given as to why, it also should be noted that the proposal also was far below the maximum build out allowed by zoning on that parcel.

As predicted, the combination of favorable downzoning, reasonable land prices and high sales and rent prices, Jefferson Park has become a viable locale for use-by-right development. The LUC looks forward to working with individuals and groups to vet ideas, and provide valuable feedback and collaboration opportunities.



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# November 6, 2012 General Election



**Voter registration deadline for this  
election: Tuesday, October 9, 2012**

The 2012 General Election in the City and County of Denver will provide you with a choice of three different ways to vote:

- Vote by mail
- Vote early at a Voter Service Center
- Vote on election day at your assigned polling place

**Vote by Mail**

Voters on the Permanent Mail-In Voter list will receive a ballot by mail for the November General Election. Your address must be current in order to receive a mail ballot. Ballots are not forwarded. If you did not vote in the November 2010 General Election, you were automatically removed from the mail ballot list. To check your status, update your address or request a mail ballot, go to [www.GoVoteColorado.com](http://www.GoVoteColorado.com).

**Vote Early**

You may vote early in the two weeks prior to Election Day at any of 13 Voter Service Centers across the city. You may also drop off a mail ballot, request a replacement for a lost or spoiled ballot, or emergency register.

**Vote on Election Day**

Denver will have 149 polling places across the city for Election Day voting. Voter Information Cards will be mailed to each voter with information regarding assigned polling places. Mail ballots may also be dropped off on Election Day at any polling place.

“No! NO! NO! I don’t want to!” your child states with his arms crossed and she is frowning. Does this sound familiar? Many families have shared that their children often have difficulty responding to their requests. Children as young as 2 years old can respond to parent’s expectations and requests.

**Here are some helpful hints to teach your child to listen to your requests:**

1. State the request clearly. When making the request from you child, explain the behavior you want to see from them “Joey will you please pick up your dog stuffed animal and place him in the toy chest?”
2. Show your child how to complete the request. For example, if you would like your child to put away toys. Walk behind your child, put your hands on their hands and gently show your child how to place the toy in the toy chest.
3. As soon as your child completes the task, praise his efforts “Joey you picked up your doggy and put him in the toy chest! Thank you!” It is important to praise the effort your child has put into trying to do a task, the more you praise his effort the more likely he will want to continue to do the task.

Sometimes children know how to do a task and are simply refusing your request. In this case, take a deep breath (to calm yourself down) and take a moment to see what is going on for your child. Is he really engaged in an activity and does not want to stop? In this case you may choose to say “Joey you can play for 3 more minutes and then it is time to pick up your toys.” When your child continues to refuse, move close to your child, getting down on his level and explain exactly what you would like to see from him. You may want to give him a choice “Would you like to first pick up your stuffed animals or your books?” so that your child feels as though he has some control over the situation. As soon as your child begins to cooperate provide your child with praise. Showing your child that you appreciate his efforts in following your request will go a long way and will increase your child’s desire to follow more requests.



¡“No! ¡NO! ¡NO! ¡No quiero”! dice su niño/a con los brazos cruzados mientras frunce el seño. ¿Le ha pasado lo mismo? Muchas familias dicen que sus hijos muchas veces tienen dificultades en responder a los pedidos de los padres. Los niños de hasta 2 años de edad pueden responder a las expectativas y pedidos de los padres. Aquí le ofrecemos unos consejos útiles para enseñarle a su niño/a a responder de la manera que usted desea a sus pedidos:

1. Exprese su pedido claramente. Cuando le pida algo a su niño/a, explique cuál es el comportamiento que espera como respuesta: “José, ¿podrías por favor levantar el perro de peluche y ponerlo dentro del baúl de juguetes”?
2. Muéstrela a su niño/a cómo debe responder a su pedido. Por ejemplo, si quiere que su niño/a guarde los juguetes, camine detrás de él/ella, ponga sus manos sobre las manos de él /ella, y suavemente muéstrela cómo poner los juguetes en el baúl.
3. Tan pronto como su niño/a termine haciendo lo que le pidió, elógielo por sus esfuerzos: “José, ¡levantaste tu perro de peluche y lo pusiste en el baúl! Gracias por ayudarme a mantener nuestra casa limpia”. Es importante elogiar a su niño/a por intentar hacer algo. Mientras más lo elogie, es más probable que quiera continuar haciendo lo que usted le pide. Desde el punto de vista Montessori, es importante mantener los elogios dirigidos específicamente a la tarea que ha completado.

Algunas veces los niños saben cómo hacer algo y solamente quieren contradecirlo a usted. En ese caso, respire profundamente (para calmarse a sí mismo) y espere un momento para ver qué le pasa a su hijo/a. ¿Está muy ocupado con otra actividad y no quiere parar? En este caso, usted puede decir: “José, puedes jugar por tres minutos más y después debes recoger tus juguetes”. Si su niño/a continúa reusándose, acérquesele, poniéndose a su mismo nivel, y explique exactamente lo que quiere que él/ella haga. Usted le podría dar una opción: ¿“Quieres levantar tus juguetes o tus libros primero”? para que su niño/a sienta que tiene algo de control sobre la situación. Tan pronto su niño empiece a cooperar, elógielo. Demostrarle a su niño/a que usted aprecia sus esfuerzos de obedecerle dará grandes resultados y aumentará el deseo de cooperar con otros pedidos.

On Friday, Oct. 12th from 5 -9:30pm and Saturday, Oct. 13th from 8:45am-5:30pm, the 7th Annual CSI Conference will be held at the Lowell Campus (Denver, CO), courtesy of the Regis University Criminology Department. This annual event planned by Faculty and Staff will showcase presentations, demos, and resources from industry experts and experienced practitioners in the fields of Criminology and crime scene investigations, as well as, inspirational stories from survivors themselves. This event is a unique and educational opportunity available to professionals, students, and interested citizens . . . **for FREE!!**

**This year's event focuses on Victimology featuring personal stories from sexual abuse and domestic violence survivors.**

Doors to the Mountain View room will open and light hors d'oeuvres will be served in the new Claver Hall Cafe. Walk-ins and additional guests are welcome as long as space is available.

### 6:00 pm - Keynote Speaker:

Detective Sergeant Jon Mattsen, Kings County Sherriff's Office, Washington State

Det. Sgt. Mattsen was one of the five original members assigned to the Green River Killings case after the perpetrator was identified through DNA. The perpetrator, Gary Ridgway (a.k.a. Green River Killer), was responsible for killing 49 females in the 1980s and 1990s – mostly prostitutes in Washington State – and dumping their bodies in and around the Green River.

Det. Sgt. Mattsen became a lead investigator and one of four primary interviewers of Ridgway when Ridgway entered into an agreement with the King County Prosecutor's Office. Sergeant Mattsen has been provided a three and a half hour block in this conference to ensure that attendees fully understand the dynamics, aberrant behaviors, investigatory efforts and consequences of this nationally-recognized crime.

### Saturday, October 13th

More than 20 different speaker presentations will be taking place throughout the day beginning at 8:45am, 10:15am, 1:45pm and 3:45pm.
