WALKDENVER'S PLEA - "MAYOR HANCOCK: IT'S TIME TO FIX FEDERAL BOULEVARD."

THE LIVES OF DENVER RESIDENTS ARE AT STAKE.

WalkDenver a non profit working towards making Denver the most walkable city in the country has recently called out Mayor Hancock and his administration regarding pedestrian fatalities on Federal Boulevard.

According to WalkDenver, so far this year, a total of 10 people, 6 of them walking, have died in crashes on Federal – a fatality rate more than 20 times the average for urban streets in Colorado.

The victims of fatal crashes on Federal come from all walks of life, but their deaths have something in common: speed is a critical factor. The speed limit

on South Federal Boulevard is 40 mph. A pedestrian struck by a car traveling that speed has a 73% chance of dying or suffering a life-altering serious injury. Federal is designed to facilitate high-speed travel and more often than not, people drive well above the posted speed limit. This is simply unacceptable for a major urban corridor lined with multifamily housing, schools, mom-and-pop businesses, parks, cultural destinations, social service providers, and major transit routes - Federal has the second highest ridership in the entire RTD system.

IT'S TIME TO FIX FEDERAL BOULEVARD

WalkDenver states that these changes to Federal Boulevard are not luxuries that can wait ten years for possible funding when the City considers another GO Bond – hundreds of people could die during that timeframe if we do nothing. Action is urgently needed to protect the health and well-being of Denver's residents, particularly the most vulnerable: children, older adults, people with disabilities, and low-income families that rely on walking, biking, and transit to meet their daily needs. Mayor Hancock and City Council should therefore include a significant allocation for Federal Boulevard in the 2018 budget.


Mayor Hancock recently announced his Mobility Action Plan that sets goals for Choice (reducing single-occupancy vehicle commutes to 50%) and Safety (eliminating traffic fatalities by 2030), among others. If Denver is serious about encouraging its residents and visitors to get out of their cars, and eliminating fatalities and serious injuries on our streets, then making Federal a more people-friendly street is the right thing to do.

Speeding was a factor in **53%** of fatalities in Denver in 2015.



The speed limit on South Federal Boulevard, home to numerous traffic fatalities, is **40 mph**.

If a pedestrian is struck by a car traveling at that speed, they have a 73% chance of dying or having a life-altering serious injury.

PROUD SOULS BRINGS THE ART OF BARBECUE TO FEDERAL BOULEVARD

Folks with a passion for barbecue want nothing more than to share that passion — along with some smoked meats. That's exactly what Tony Roberts and Dan Casey, two friends who have been cooking together on the competitive barbecue circuit for years, plan to do. The two will open Proud Souls Barbecue & Provisions at 2485 Federal Boulevard in early October, adding an outdoor-cooking supply shop and barbecue-catering company where a tire shop once stood.

Proud Souls will stock pellet smokers, as well as PK grills, offset barrel smokers and ceramic models; the partners will also offer advice on which cooking methods and cuts of meat work best with each style of cooker.

Because of the location of their new shop, they're looking into manufacturing their own line of cookers. "One thing we're working on, since this is kind of an urban environment, is a small-footprint smoker," Roberts explains. It will be perfect for barbecue enthusiasts who rent or live on small properties in central Denver and may not have the space or money to invest in larger cookers.

BOYS SCHOOL OF DENVER



You may have noticed large groups of boys running around Jefferson Park recently. They're the students of the newly opened DPS school, The Boys School of Denver, which is currently located in Riverside Church at 24th and Alcott.

Students at The Boys School of

Denver participate in movement before they head to classes, as the school has a focus on health & wellness. So, when you see them running in the park, they're readying their brains for the school day ahead. Students also take 'brain boosts' during their classes and use kinesthetic learning to maximize academic achievement.

School leaders say they're thrilled to join such a vibrant and kind community. Executive Director, Carol Bowar, says, "We have felt so welcomed by Riverside Church and by the Jefferson Park community. Several residents have mentioned how joyous it is to see the boys running in the mornings. We love being so close to such a beautiful city space, and are grateful to utilize the park for this integral part of our school model – Movement!"

The Boys School of Denver is a Denver Public Schools charter middle school serving boys in grades 6 - 8. It is the brother school of Girls Athletic Leadership Schools and shares their model and mission. The Boys School opened with 6th grade in the fall and will expand one grade level each year. The Boys School provides a tuition-free college preparatory education in a supportive environment that encourages students to know themselves and develop into strong leaders. DENVER'S LEAFDROP PROGRAM

The leaves are changing colors and will soon fall, but make sure they don't fall on Denver's streets or in the trash! Starting Monday, October 2, turn fallen leaves into compost through Denver Recycles' LeafDrop program. Weekday drop-off sites will be open to Denver residents through Friday, December 8. The leaves collected through this program will be turned into a high-quality compost, which will be made available for Denver residents to purchase in May.

Monday through Friday, 8:00am to 2:00pm

- Cherry Creek Transfer Station 7301 E. Jewell Ave. (Quebec St. & Cherry Creek Dr. South)
- Havana Nursery 10450 Smith Rd. (Just south of I-70 on Havana St.)

Please note, all leaves must be in secured bags (paper bags are preferred) and dropped-off during hours of operation, otherwise it is considered illegal dumping.


Another way to be environmentally friendly, break the plastic bag habit and use paper bags when raking fallen leaves instead – paper bags can also be composted! Denver Recycles and Ace Hardware are teaming up to give away 25,000 paper leaf bags this year! Denver residents can print a coupon for a free 5-pack of paper leaf bags at www.denvergov.org/leafdrop. The coupon can be redeemed at participating Denver area Ace Hardware stores.

Help us manage the LeafDrop program by following these guidelines:

- Bring your leaves in paper leaf bags, if possible.
- Drop-off sites and free Ace Hardware paper bag offer is for Denver residents only.
- Jack-O-Lanterns and pumpkins will be accepted for composting at drop-off sites.
- Make sure leaves do not contain branches or other materials.
- Never rake or blow leaves into the street, as this clogs storm sewers and street sweepers.
