


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# CONCERN ABOUT CRIME



## Since the start of August, Jefferson Park has seen some of the most crime in all of Denver.

Our neighborhood now ranks in the top ten of "Crime Density per Square Mile." Amongst the crimes reported include aggravated assaults, smash and grabs at local businesses, residential burglaries, theft from motor vehicles, and auto thefts.

## What Can Be Done? Get Involved!

Helping deter criminal activity starts with community involvement. DPD recommends a "See Something Say Something" approach. If a crime is being committed call 911 and let the dispatcher know you would like to receive police contact (follow up) about the situation. Contact could be either in person or via phone. This action requires the police to track the incident, holds them more accountable for their actions and potentially elevates the call for dispatch.

# Our Out of This World's Newest Neighbor Set to Open September 17th!

Meow Wolf's third permanent immersive experience, "Convergence Station" opens in Denver on September 17.

Become part of the story and explore the cosmic collision of

four worlds -- kaleidoscopic cathedrals, Corinthian catacombs, lush alien habitats and dazzling but gritty cityscapes -- to investigate the disappearances of 4 women 25 years ago.


The four floors of the installation incorporate over three years of work by hundreds of artists and collaborators with 79 "mind-bending" projects with titles like "Ruptured Time," "Crystal Future" and "Indigenous Futurist Dreamscapes Lounge." The number of projects will continue to grow as Meow Wolf will look for new Denver artists to collaborate with every year.

The \$60 million building, is wedged between Auraria Parkway, Colfax, and Interstate 25 in Sun Valley, one of the oldest communities in Denver and a melting pot of immigrants and refugees. Having strong local ties is important to Meow Wolf. The café is serving beer from the Latinx-owned Raices Brewery down the street. Of the 300 or so artists represented in the space, 110 of them are from Colorado. And the overarching narrative behind Convergence Station is inspired by the surrounding neighborhood of Sun Valley.

Tickets for Convergence Station are now on sale for \$45; \$35 for Colorado residents.



# Denver Water @ JPUN Meeting September 14

Denver Water is reaching out to customers who have or may have a lead service line as they begin a 15-year effort to locate and replace the estimated 64,000 to 84,000 lead service lines, which includes Jefferson Park. These service lines do not belong to Denver Water, they belong to the property owner, much like a driveway also is the responsibility of the property owner. However, as part of the Lead Reduction Program, these lead service lines will be replaced at no direct charge to the customer. Denver Water is also providing customers in the program with a free pitcher and water filter, as well as replacement filters, to use for drinking, cooking and preparing infant formula until six months after their lead service line is replaced.

A representative from Denver Water will be at our Sept 14 meeting to share information about the Lead Reduction Program, answer questions and provide tips and tricks to help you get the most out of your water pitcher and filter."

# Tips for Watering Trees in Denver

In Denver's semi-arid climate, trees and water are both precious resources. However, with a few expert tips, you can preserve mature trees on your property and establish new trees that will help grow our urban canopy, diminish heat islands, and combat the arrival of Emerald Ash Borer.

#### Does my tree need more water?

In most cases, sprinkler irrigation and natural moisture from the occasional rainstorm do not provide consistent moisture for trees in Denver. It can be difficult, however, to tell whether a tree needs additional water simply by looking at it, so follow these tips to determine your tree's needs:

• Stick your finger into the soil at the base of your tree: o If it easily penetrates, the tree is adequately watered o If it's difficult to penetrate the dirt, the tree needs more water

o If you observe standing water in the hole when you pull your finger out, the tree is over-watered, which can be as damaging as under-watering

• A soil moisture meter is another option for determining a tree's watering needs

#### How much water does my tree need?

Once you've determined that your tree needs more water, there are some standard guidelines for determining exactly how much. Regardless of the tree's age, a tree in a nonirrigated area needs 10 gallons of water per week per inch of trunk diameter. For example, a two-inch diameter tree requires 20 gallons of water per week. This can be spaced out over two to three days per week. An easy way to match your watering technique to your tree's needs is to put a hose on a low-pressure setting and put it into a 5-gallon bucket (commonly found at home improvement stores), then time how long it takes to fill the bucket. Once you know the timing for your watering system, start a clock and move your hose around the base of your tree.

#### How do I effectively water my tree?


A simple hose is the most basic tool needed to water your tree, but soaker hoses, soft spray nozzles and soil needles can help break through the soil surface. Most absorbing tree roots are found in the first 12-inches of soil depth, so be sure water is applied slowly and has time to absorb into the soil and reach these vital roots.

Adding mulch around the base of your tree is a simple and effective way to help retain moisture. A maximum mulch depth of three- to five-inches is optimal, but be careful not to let the mulch directly contact the trunk of the tree.

#### **Additional resources**

Before you begin any watering program, it's important to get familiar with Denver Water's summer outdoor watering rules, which take into account our high summer temperatures and recent drought conditions. And while hand-watering trees is not restricted, we encourage following the recommended watering times of between 6 p.m. and 10 a.m. to optimize your efforts.

The Colorado State University (CSU) Extension is also a great resource for tree care and other home landscaping needs, including seasonal watering recommendations that are customized to our unique Colorado climate.

# Installation of 23rd Ave Bike Lane

In Early September, the City and County of Denver will begin installing this new high comfort bikeway along W 23rd Avenue from Federal Boulevard east to Water Street, and to the Speer Boulevard Overpass/South Platte River Trail. The project aims to improve safety for all by dedicating space on the street for people to rides bike, providing elements of vertical separation between cars and bikes to reduce conflict and lower the stress of travelling on the corridor.

This project will reduce parking spots on 23rd Avenue. People may want to choose alternate travel routes during installation as they may encounter delays when crews are working.

#### **Project History**

This corridor is popular for biking, providing a direct connection to downtown and destinations beyond. In 2017, funding for a protected bikeway along this stretch was approved through the Elevate Denver Bond Program. Public meetings were held in 2019 to gather feedback on design options.
