




Federal and 25th Redesign Your Input Needed!

Colorado Leads Nation in Auto Thefts

From 2019 to 2020 theft from motor vehicles was up 29.2% and grew by another 2.6% in 2022. During that time period auto theft was up a startling 58.8% and jumped another 48.6 % in 2021. The Commonsense Institute found Colorado had the highest auto theft rate of all states.

Since February 13th, we've observed a rise in auto theft of particular makes and models:

- 13 Kia models (Sportage leads the pack here, but also had 2 Sorento models)
- 13 Hyundai models (Elantra x2, Sonata x3, Accent x2, Tucson x2 with a Santa Fe and Veloster rounding it out)
- 9 Chevrolets with 4 Silverados and 2 Tahoes
- 9 Fords with 3 F150s, 2 F250s, and 3 F350s
- And 8 Hondas 2 Civics, 2 motorcycles, 1 each of the following: Accord, VRV, Element, and Odyssey.

If you own a vehicle of these makes and models, we do have steering wheel clubs to help detour the theft of your vehicle.



Denver couple opens Petunia Bakeshop in Jefferson Park

Diana and Manuel Guzman have been ready years to open their bakery in Jefferson Park. Manuel, who additionally sells restaurant and bakery gear, used cash from his different enterprise for the renovations.

"He'd sell a mixer after which we'd be able to redo the flooring, which is why it took us so long," Diana stated.

The Guzmans beforehand owned Cake Depot, a cake provide retailer firm that they opened in the identical 2,000-square-foot area in 2011.

In 2020, the couple offered Cake Depot to a buyer, Eva Crespo, who moved the provision retailer to the opposite finish of the retail strip at 3014 W. twenty third Ave., and so they put that cash towards the opening of Petunia Bakeshop.

Diana, 39, took cake adorning courses at Emily Griffith Technical School and obtained a baking and pastry cooking degree at Johnson & Wales College. Guzman has employed two of her classmates from Johnson & Wales to assist her within the kitchen.

The bakery sells espresso, croissants, bread, cookies, Danishes, muffins, cake slices and customized muffins, and it plans so as to add extra Mexican pastries and

desserts, like tres leches sooner or later.

Redistricting 2022 Meetings

Majority of Councilmembers Keep Jefferson Park in District 1


Every 10 years after U.S. Census data is released, the Denver city council is required by the Charter to redraw the 11 city council districts.

Why is it important?

Redistricting ultimately shapes the political landscape in Denver, and is an important process to make sure the People have the opportunity to choose who represents them. Denver has changed over the past 10 years with an increase in Denverites, new buildings, and amenities. Our council boundaries need to be altered to reflect these changes and how they are represented at the municipal-level. These new boundaries will remain in effect for 10 years, determining representation on important issues until 2035.

There is not a lot of change of redistricting boundaries for Jefferson Park in Councilmember Herndon, Clark, Hinds, Kashmann, Black and Sandoval. Councilmember Torres is the only Council member who wants to move Jefferson Park out of District 1 and into District 10.

Redistricting Timeline

Denver City Council is required to approve its new council district boundaries before April 4th, 2022. This is due to our municipal elections being moved up a month from May to April (as was approved via ballot initiative last November). Anyone running for city council is required to live in their council district for one year prior to the election, which is why council has such a short timeline to approve its new boundaries.
