

DENNIS GALLAGHER, DENVER POLITICO AND NEIGHBORHOOD ADVOCATE, HAS DIED



"HE WOULD ALWAYS TALK ABOUT LEAVING THE CITY A BETTER PLACE THAN YOU FOUND IT."

Dennis Gallagher passed away at his Northwest Denver home April 22, 2021 at age 82. He was a well-respected leader for Denver and Colorado.

Dennis J. Gallagher taught speech, persuasion and media for 42 years, even while he was building up an impressive

resume in government service. He was initially elected to the Colorado House of Representatives in 1970 where he served two terms before switching to the State Senate and serving 20 more years there. In 1982, he sponsored the "Gallagher Amendment" to the state constitution. This amendment stabilized the residential property share of the statewide property tax base. After leaving the legislature, Gallagher served two terms on the Denver City Council before being elected City Auditor in 2003 where he served until 2014.

He had such great stories and knowledge of the history of our Country, State and City. Denver and St Patrick's Day won't be the same without him.

Colfax Viaduct South of Stadium Re-purposed

ON MAY 14, SUN VALLEY KITCHEN + COMMUNITY CENTER, ALONG WITH THE WEST COLFAX BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT AND DENVER STREETS PARTNERSHIP, WILL HOST THE SUN VALLEY RISING VIADUCT NIGHT MARKET, AN EVENING EVENT FILLED WITH LOCAL FOOD AND ART VENDORS.

The market will be located at the south end of Empower Field under the Colfax Viaduct west of Raices and east of the Latino Cultural Arts Center at 2705 W. Colfax Ave. The event is part of the West Denver Rising Initiative's international marketplace series, which will include five events across west Denver celebrating the area's various cultures. The first event was the Lunar New Year celebration in Little Saigon on South Federal Boulevard. Denver Streets Partnership and other organizers were able to secure grant funding which helped spread it to more locations along the corridor and invite the larger community to come and participate.


The other events will include an additional marketplace under the viaduct in Sun Valley in August, the Mid-Autumn Festival at the Far East Center in September and the annual Westwood Chile Fest on Morrison Road, also in September.

West Denver Rising is a collaboration between Sun Valley, Little Saigon and BuCu West Development Association. Besides all being on the westside, Westwood, Sun Valley and Villa Park and other neighborhoods are experiencing rapid development and are considered high-risk for displacement, according to the city. The initiative is their way of banding together to ensure their communities stay their communities.

As with the established events like Chile Fest and the Lunar New Year celebration, the Viaduct Night Market will feature local westside vendors, like Raices, and musicians like Los Mocochetes. But the night market will also give locals who aren't established an opportunity to show off their craft.

Some of the vendors will be people who are interested in starting businesses of their own but who don't yet have the capital or skills to get off the ground. It's an opportunity to learn and build entrepreneurial skills. **Excerpts from Denverite**.

I-25: Speer & 23rd Bridge and Interchange Project

CDOT's main focus is to replace the bridges that cross over Interstate 25 at Speer Boulevard and 23rd Ave in Denver

They are also looking at ways to improve safety and operations – for the on and off ramps as well as for pedestrian and bicycle connections across the highway at these bridges.

The Project limits include I-25 between 20th Street and W. Colfax Avenue. There will be a range of options to consider for the interchanges, all of which will support broader goals for I-25 and the surrounding infrastructure, known as the I-25 corridor.


Why is it happening? The bridges at Speer and 23rd are aged, have substandard bike/ped facilities on the bridges, and have inadequate clearances below. An earlier study, known as the I-25 Central Planning and Environmental Linkages (PEL) Study, identified these spots as a highpriority, early-action project to:

- improve safety, such as by reducing dangerous stop-and-go traffic,
- reduce congestion on I-25 to improve travel time reliability, and
- increase connectivity between the Highlands, Jefferson Park, and Downtown neighborhoods through bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure.

When is it happening? CDOT started developing design concepts for the project in the summer of 2021 and will be working with stakeholders through mid-2023 to choose the best solution. The final design process for the preferred solution is then expected to last around two years, after which construction will begin.

DENVER LAUNCHES 16TH STREET MALL RENOVATION



INITIATIVE WILL REPLACE AGING INFRASTRUCTURE AND ENHANCE THE VISITOR EXPERIENCE

The 16th Street Mall Project is the first major renovation of this vital downtown corridor since its opening in 1982. A primary driver for the project is the need to address deteriorating infrastructure, specifically the granite paver system, that results in poor drainage, frequent disruptions to the transit system and maintenance costs of more than \$1M annually.


Highlights of the 16th Street Mall project include:

- Replacing the mall's existing granite paver system with one that drains more effectively and offers greater surface friction to improve pedestrian safety.
- Moving the transit lanes to the center of the Mall, eliminating the median that runs between the buses on some blocks, and creating wider pedestrian walkways and new amenity zones for leisure, commerce, entertainment, and tourism.
- Expanding and diversifying the Mall's tree canopy
- Honoring the Mall's iconic original design by I.M. Pei and Associates, and Olin
- Exciting new art that will draw people to the corridor

Access to all businesses will be maintained throughout the project. Colorful and abundant wayfinding signage with feel-good imagery will help people navigate the Mall and get where they want to go. A brightly-wrapped portable trailer will be onsite throughout, providing a place for people to visit and learn more about the project. An opportunity to meet with the construction team in person will occur monthly, with a schedule provided on the project's website at www.denvergov.org/16thStreetMall. People can also stay connected to the project by searching "16th Street Mall Project" in the Apple or Google Play stores and downloading a mobile app.

The 16th Street Mall renovation will improve infrastructure on 13 blocks along the corridor from Market Street to Broadway. Work will start in the center/transitway area on Block 1 between Market and Larimer Streets, with a new adjacent block entering construction approximately four to eight weeks later. Each block will be under construction for approximately 18 months. The project will wrap up at the end of 2024.

The RTD Free MallRide shuttle will continue to run during the 16th Street Mall project, rerouted to 15th and 17th Streets as needed. RTD will update the public on their MallRide page.




Take a selfie with your bike.
