### CITY OFFICIALS TO DISCUSS MIGRANT CRISIS AT FEB 13 JPUN MEETING

The encampment of newly arrived migrants started on a strip of grass where TV reporters often do live remotes at Speer and Zuni during the early summer of 2023. It steadily grew throughout the year to encompass the Rodeway Inn and stretch south along Alcott.

All of it culminated on January 3, 2024, when the city deemed the camps unsafe and had police and city workers clear the area.

The area is now littered with protective fencing though migrants still remain in the area unsure where to go next.

You can read a recent national **CNN article** posted on January 31st detailing how Denver is nearing the breaking point with such a large population influx along with a **Denverite article** detailing the sweeps on Jan 3rd.

As of publication, city officials including Deputy Chief of Staff - Mayor's Office, Denver's Housing and Stability, Department of Human Service and Councilwoman Sandoval have confirmed they will attend.

# DPS SCHOOL CHOICE WINDOW IS NOW OPEN!

DPS SchoolChoice for the 2024-25 school year is now open through 4 p.m. Feb. 12!

The process is for students who want or need to attend a new school for the following school year, particularly incoming kindergarten, sixth- and ninth-grade students. All incoming ECE students, as well as incoming students who reside in an enrollment zone, must complete an application.

Research your school options using the **School Finder**, **Enrollment Guides**, **FAQs** or by contacting schools directly.

To apply, **create an account** or sign in using your Parent Portal login. Then, rank your schools in order of preference and submit your application before 4 p.m. Feb. 12.

Results will be released late March.

# FEDERAL BOULEVARD PEDESTRAIN SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT W 23RD AVE TO W 27 AVE

### DAYTIME LANE CLOSURES ON FEDERAL BOULEVARD

Crews continue reconstruction of W. 25th Avenue east of Federal Boulevard. To safely remove and construct a more pedestrian-friendly street, a full closure of W. 25th Avenue from Federal Boulevard east, halfway to Eliot Street, is in place through the spring. Vehicle and pedestrian traffic are advised to detour east via 24th or 26th Avenues to Eliot Street to access 25th Avenue. Pedestrian access to businesses on W. 25th Avenue will be maintained.

To support reconstruction parking is temporarily restricted on W. 25th Avenue between Federal Boulevard and Eliot Street through the spring.

Underground work on Federal Boulevard will require daily intermittent lane closure, from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, January 16 through Friday, February 9.

Travelers are encouraged to choose alternate routes to avoid these temporary lane closures and travel impacts. Weather or additional unforeseen circumstances may affect the schedule.

Denver's Department of Transportation and Infrastructure (DOTI), in partnership with its contractor, Concrete Express, continue to provide safety improvements for Federal Boulevard between West 23rd and West 27th Avenues and create a safer environment for pedestrians crossing the stretch and accessing local business destinations.

#### Project improvements include:

- Upgrading pedestrian ramps on Federal Blvd at West 25th and West 26th Avenues.
- Adding concrete bulb-outs at several corners to shorten pedestrian crossing distances and slow vehicle turns.
- Installing a HAWK signal on Federal Blvd. at West 25th Avenue. People on foot and on bikes can activate the


HAWK signal to stop vehicles traveling on Federal to cross the street more safely.

- Transform West 25th Avenue from Federal Blvd to Eliot Street into a more pedestrian friendly street with a narrowed and curved design to slow vehicle speeds (known as a chicane) and install green infrastructure on this block to provide water quality and natural plantings to beautify and cool the environment.
- Upgrade the stormwater infrastructure at W. 25th and W. 26th Avenues and on Eliot Street to improve drainage and reduce flood risks.

#### **OPEN PROJECT MAP**

Throughout the work, operations will require travel impacts along this stretch of Federal Boulevard. Crews will utilize intermittent lane closures and shift the path of vehicle travel to support the safety of the workers. Crews will also require temporary sidewalk closures. Alternate access/routes will be provided. Residents can stay informed by visiting our webpage. The project is anticipated to wrap up by fall 2024.

All work is weather dependent and will be rescheduled if conditions do not permit crews to safely complete planned operations.

West 38th Avenue Corridor Study

### **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

Denver's Department of Transportation and Infrastructure (DOTI) has launched the West 38th Avenue Corridor Study to improve mobility and safety, plan for Bus Rapid Transit (BRT), and identify ways to 'green' the corridor. The study intends to build upon public input, findings, and recommendations from previous relevant studies.

West 38th Avenue has been identified as a corridor in need of investment through various previous projects, each with its own community outreach efforts and outcomes. The corridor study will begin by analyzing the feasibility and compatibility of these previous recommendations and current community needs.

The study's intended outcome is to create a cohesive plan for the entire corridor that guides future capital improvement projects and adjacent development.




### LEAD REDUCTION IN JEFFERSON PARK




### CIVIC CENTER STARGAZE

### GET PAID TO RIDE YOUR BIKE

Denver Streets Partnership is launching a new pilot program, in partnership with Denver's Office of Climate Action, Sustainability and Resiliency, to incentivize Denverites to ride their bikes more!

The program is aimed at folks who mostly get around by car but would be more inclined to ride a bike in exchange for resources like coaching, a stipend toward bike needs, or cash. If that sounds like you, check out their webpage for more information and to apply.

Application are prioritized from residents of historically disinvested communities in Denver, low-income folks and people of color, since they have been burdened the most from our current transportation system and would stand to benefit the most from participating in this pilot. However, we're taking all applications, regardless of whether or not you meet these criteria. So if you've looked longingly at your bike sitting unused in your garage and wished you had something to nudge you to use it for transportation (besides, obviously, better infrastructure and policies making it safer and more convenient), take a look at the program and apply before February 29, 2024.

They are also hiring for three part-time Bike Buddies to provide support to the participants in this program.

Each Bike Buddy will be assigned to multiple participants and provide up to 4 hours of personalized assistance to each participant, including route-finding for specific locations, and bicycle safety and maintenance.

### DENVER TACKLES AUTO THEFT


The Denver Police Department and Mayor Mike Johnston have teamed up to introduce a new auto theft program in an effort to tackle the ongoing problem.

It is a part of a five-part plan as the city looks to hire more officers to provide help to drivers who are at the greatest risk of being stolen due to software updates.

The department also solidified the Denver Auto Theft team, which is helping and encouraging drivers to sign up for its track program that works along with the vehicle's GPS system to locate stolen cars in real-time.

The city has been a hotspot for auto thefts in a state that has been among the worst nationwide for years, but a city and overall state decrease has officials looking to expand efforts to reduce the crime even further. Denver saw a 19% decrease in 2023 and the state's Auto Theft Prevention Authority recorded a 21% decrease overall from 2022 to 2023.

DPD's final plan includes installing 111 special cameras called Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR) that will be built into 70 intersections around the city. The cameras have the ability to scan and read the license plates of stolen vehicles. Once the car is identified as stolen, the cameras will scan for the license plate to find where the vehicle is currently located so motorists can recover it quicker.

The license plate reader technology will not only be used for auto theft but will also help solve violent crimes along with hit-and-run incidents.


